Do you know what to do with your gas supply in an emergency?

Above average temperatures and below average rainfall can result in the increased risk of bushfire.

AusNet Services is working around the clock to make sure the communities are bushfire ready.



IN AN EMERGENCY...

DO

1. Ensure all gas appliances are switched off, including the cooker hotplates, pilot lights, and hot-water systems
2. Turn off the gas supply at the meter when leaving your property or you are preparing to defend it

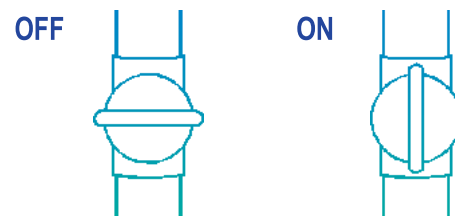
DO NOT

1. Turn on your gas supply after a fire as damaged components may not be visible or obvious
2. Turn on gas fittings after a fire until they have been checked by a licensed gas fitter
